

doors of his parish - Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany.

This Contemporary Praise and Worship song focuses on Jesus Christ Alone, even though His name isn't given, but who He is and what He has done, is doing and will yet do is extolled.

Which is titled "Finding God Through Music blog"

The historicity of the Resurrection was raised as background for the song "All The Earth Will Sing Your Praises." The first two lines of the first verse of the song declare the central belief of Christianity: "You lived, You died, You said in three days You would rise. You did, You're alive." With the groundwork laid, Paul continues expanding this conviction, singing: "You rule, You reign, You said You're coming back again I know You will." Jesus Christ, the Savior, the Messiah, is Lord of All. Christian faith declares that Jesus will come back to judge the living and the dead, as proclaimed in the both the Apostle's Creed and the Nicene Creed, as well as in the writings of St. Paul.

Continuing in the song, the final lines of this first verse incorporate messages expressed in both the Old and New Testaments: "all the earth will sing your praises". In Daniel Chapter 3, it is clearly proclaimed that not only people and nations praise the Lord, but that everything should praise the Lord: rain, snow, chill, warm, mountains, hills, rivers, springs, all living creatures of the earth. This doctrine is echoed by St. Paul who states "at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth" (Phil 2:10).

The second verse explains that Jesus came to earth to take away our sins. He allowed himself to be sacrificed on the cross as a sign of his infinite love. Through this expression of love, we are given the perfect example of how we are to live our lives, which is by loving others as God loves us.

The song returns to the first verse, declaring our belief in the life, death, and Resurrection of Jesus. He is our Lord and Savior. With such a powerful message of hope and love, how can we not join the earth, and sing, no, shout our praises to the Lord?

The Evangelical Catechism Traditional Orthodox Edition of 1896

In 2018, the Evangelical Association republished, in modern English, the open source, 1896, edition of the Evangelical Catechism. The following is taken from the Introduction to this Edition.

"As stated in the preface to the 1916 book Evangelical Fundamentals – *The Evangelical Catechism Explained*, "Next to the Bible the Evangelical Catechism is the most important element in the Evangelical scheme of Christian education, In it there have been laid down the fundamentals of Christian teaching as gathered from the Bible in accordance with the principle expressed in the Evangelical doctrinal statement. Because familiarity with these teachings is essential to true Christian life and conduct, the study of the Catechism has been made a part of the regular confirmation instruction, and the importance of a thorough study of its contents cannot easily be exaggerated."

Our confirmation instruction is greatly reduced from what it was generations ago. Now we only have one hour during Sunday School for 2 years. So, a proper presentation and study of the Catechism isn't possible. Therefore, I am including a presentation of it in our Newsletter.

This version has been formatted into a 52-week study, like the Heidelberg Catechism, which was part of the basis of it. The other basis was Luther's Catechism. So, the Evangelical Catechism is a Reformation Catechism coming from our Lutheran and Reformed heritage. And, in honor of Reformation Sunday later this month, I am be-


Polka Sunday, Oct. 16

Pumpkin Butter

- 3 cans (15 oz. each) pumpkin 2 cups sugar
- 1 1/2 cups water
- 1 1/2 cups wate
- 3 tablespoons lemon juice
- 1 tablespoon grated lemon zest
- 3 teaspoons cinnamon
- 3/4 teaspoon salt
- 3/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- : 3/4 teaspoon ground ginger

In a large saucepan, combine all ingredients. Bring to a boil, stirring frequently. Reduce heat; cover and simmer for 20 minutes to allow flavors to blend. Cool. Spoon into jars. Cover and store in refrigerator for up to 3 weeks.
