

- 10 Days to join the global church in obedience, watching and waiting on God.

Watchman Nee and An Inspiring 10 Days Story from China.

You can read the brief inspiring note about his life in the prayer guide that ends with the statement below.

Watchman Nee came to faith during a 10 Days Revival. He endured through persecution to the end of his life, still proclaiming his faith. He is a model for all who seek to follow Jesus. As we begin 10 Days this year, let's ask God to birth new believers like Nee during this set-apart season!

Three Words.

This year's prayer guide is patterned after Nee's most famous work, Sit, Walk, Stand. In this short commentary, Nee summarizes Paul's entire letter to the Ephesians in three words:

1. SIT: Our Position in Christ: (Ephesians 1-3)

'[God] raised us up with [Christ] and seated us with him in the heavenly places" (2:6)

2. WALK: Our Life in the World: (Ephesians 4:1-6:9)

"Walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called" (4:1)

3. STAND: Our Attitude to the Enemy: (Ephesians 6:10-24)

"Stand against the schemes of the devil" (6:11)

Sister Janet Mead, a South Australian nun who had a 1970s hit with a rock version of "**The Lord's Prayer**" that made her the first Australian with a US gold record, has died at 84, on January 26, 2022 of cancer, according to the The Catholic Archdiocese of Adelaide, Australia.

She rose to fame in Australia after her "Rock Masses," recorded at St. Francis Xavier Cathedral in Adelaide, came to the attention of Festival Records. Her 1973 recording of "**The Lord's Prayer**" sold 2 million copies and was distributed in 31 countries.

The song rose to No. 3 on the Australian singles chart and No. 4 on the Billboard Hot 100. All of the royal-ties on the recording were donated to charity by Mead.

Mead entered the Sisters of Mercy convent in 1955 after attending St. Aloysius College in Adelaide. She also attended the Adelaide Conservatorium, where she studied piano.

During her career, she produced multiple plays, liturgies, and more than 20 musicals and also ran the St. Aloysius College orchestra for many years. Her work saw her recognized as South Australian of the Year in 2004. She was also recognized for her services to Australian Christian music and given the Golden Gospel Award.

So, pray and sing "The Lord's Prayer." Do so with a joyful heart as a son or a daughter of Our Father

Cranberry Orange Sauce

1 (12 ounce) bag fresh cranberries 1/2 cup sugar Zest of 1 orange

1/4 cup of freshly squeezed orange juice
