

#### Christmas

In despair over the commercialism of Christmas Charlie Brown asks, "Isn't there anyone who knows what Christmas is all about?" Linus answers, "Sure, I can tell you what Christmas is all about." Then Linus announces the Good News the angels delivered to the shepherds - Luke 2:10-12, "Be not afraid; for behold, I bring you good news of a great joy which will come to all the people; for to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find a babe wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger."

Charlie Brown takes the little Christmas tree and puts one ornament on it, but it collapses. Again, in despair, he cries out "I've killed it, everything I touch gets ruined," then he leaves. But Linus wraps his trusty blanket around it and says "maybe it just needs a little love." Then the kids decorate it and begin humming, "Hark! the Herald Angels Sing."

Hearing their humming Charlie Brown returns to see the miracle of the transformation of the little tree. The show then ends with them singing, with the greatest joy, the first verse of "Hark! the Herald Angels Sing," given below (written by Charles Wesley).

What man has ruined by our sin God has fixed by His Grace, mercy and love. For God has sent us His promised Savior, Christ the Lord. Therefore, you and I, like Charlie Brown, can sing with Joy from the heart, because God has stepped in to save us and make life worth the living.

The angel's message to the shepherds was made into song in 1739 by Charles Wesley in "Hark! the Herald Angels Sing" and made into a memorable children's story in 1965 by Charles M. Schulz in "A Charlie Brown Christmas." These celebrate the Evangel, the greatest Good News of all time – the birth of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior.

So, this Advent and Christmas season, bring the whole family together and watch this Christmas favorite with the heart of a child. Join us on Christmas Eve as we sing this and many other wonderful Christmas carols, hymns and songs.

The following is taken from 101 More Hymn Stories, by Kenneth W. Osbeck, published in 1985.

"Hark! The Herald Angels Sing" is another of the more than 6,500 hymns from the pen of Charles Wesley that has enriched Christian hymnody. It is thought to have been written approximately one year after his dramatic, Aldersgate conversion experience of 1738. This text is generally considered to be one of Wesley's finest. According to John Julian, noted hymnologist, this is one of the 4 most popular hymns in the English language. It certainly has become one of the classic Christmas carol hymns.

In its original version, the text consisted of 10 four-line stanzas. Like so many of Wesley's hymns, this text is really a condensed course in Biblical doctrine in poetic form. Following the re-telling of the angelic visit to the shepherds in the initial stanza, the succeeding verses teach such spiritual truths as the virgin birth, Christ's deity, the immortality of the soul, the second or new birth, and a concern for Christ-like living. Wesley's hymns were composed in order that men and women might sing their way, not only into experience, but also into knowledge; that the cultured might have their culture baptized and the ignorant might be led into truth by the gentle hand of melody and rhyme.

So join us in singing this and so many other wonderful Christmas psalms, hymns and spiritual songs all throughout this Advent and Christmas season.





#### The Evangelical Catechism **Traditional Orthodox Edition of 1896**

I am continuing the series of articles on the 1896 edition of the Evangelical Catechism, republished in modern English by the Evangelical Association in 2018. This article covers the 3<sup>rd</sup> of 52 weeks in the catechism. This moves us from the Introduction (weeks 1 and 2) to The 10 Commandments (weeks 3 through 13).

Week 3 is composed of questions 6 through 8.

6. What is the First Commandment?

I am the Lord your God, who has brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage. You shall have no other gods before me.

7. What does God require in the First Commandment?

God requires that we fear and love Him, and trust in Him above all things. Eccles. 12:13; 1 John 5:3; Ps. 37:5; Prov. 3:5

8. What does God forbid in this Commandment?

God forbids having any other gods besides Him. Matt. 4:10; Isaiah 42:8; 1 John 2:15; Matt. 10:37; Jer. 17:5

May you be blessed as you examine one of the founding statements of our Evangelical faith and heritage.

#### **Spiced German Cookies**

1 cup butter

1 cup sugar 2 eggs

2 tsp. vanilla

1 tsp. lemon extract

3 1/2 cups flour 2 tsp. baking powder

1 tsp. each cardamom, coriander, cinnamon, clove

1/2 tsp. salt

3/4 cup slivered almonds

In large bowl, cream butter and sugar until fluffy. Beat in eggs and extracts. Whisk flour, baking powder, spices and salt; gradually add to creamed mixture. Divide dough in half, shape into a disk, wrap in plastic, refrigerate 1 hour. Preheat oven to 350. Roll each dough to 1/8 inch thickness. Cut with cookie cutter. Decorate top with almonds. Bake 9-11 minutes or until light brown. Enjoy!

you have songs that you would like for Church please contact a committee member or Pastor Darrell.


**Cemetery** Kurt Pellmann reported that the cemetery has been surveyed for the rod iron fence that the Eckert Estate has left money for.
