From the Desk of Pastor Darrell

Worship the LORD!!!

Both the historical and biblical record reveal the Lord's Day, Sunday, was the chosen gathering day for distinctly Christian worship because "it was the day Jesus rose from the dead." Every Sunday the church gathers together to Worship God – the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Worshipping The LORD ("Jehovah," or more correctly "Yahweh") God is the central and foundational response of Christians and therefore for Christ's Church. Worship comes first, before anything and everything else, because the LORD, who alone is God, is first, before and above anything and everything else.

Years ago, Zion's Sanctuary, and churches of all denominations across the U.S., were overflowing each and every Sunday with Worshippers. But now, our Sanctuary, and most others, are mostly empty. In the past, children sat with their parents, grand-parents and even great grandparents to Worship the LORD God. Now, only a few multi-generational families gather to Worship. For those who bear the name Christian, this isn't right.

So, to the 60 or 70 who do gather each Sunday at Zion to Worship the LORD, I say, "Well done thou good and faithful servants."

To those who Worship only on a monthly basis goes this query, "What's keeping you from the weekly worship of the LORD?"

To those who Worship only occasionally (maybe at Christmas and Easter), "Why do you Worship the LORD only on those days, and not every week?"

To those on Zion's membership rolls who do not come to Worship the LORD here, goes the question: "Are you Worshipping the LORD elsewhere?" If so, we rejoice that you have found a church home. Let us know so that we will gladly release you from our church rolls to that congregation.

If you are not Worshipping elsewhere, "What has caused you to give up the Worship of the LORD?"

Obviously, those in care facilities or shut-in at home can't join us. Yet, all the care facilities I know of provide Worship opportunities (e.g., I am at Garden Place in Millstadt leading Worship on the second Thursday of each month, and all of Zion's members there as well as others join us in Worship).

Those required to work on Sundays speak with Zion's Council. Maybe we can develop an early Saturday evening Worship Service, similar to what our Catholic friends have at St. James.

The LORD is calling "Return to me, and I will return to you, says the LORD of hosts," (Malachi 3:7). Jesus is telling me, "Therefore say to them, Thus says the LORD of hosts: Return to me, says the LORD of hosts, and I will return to you, says the LORD of hosts" (Zechariah 1:3).

In the midst of God's judgment on His people Israel, in the time of the prophet Joel, came the call to return to Him. Even now in our time of the LORD's judgment on our land and world, comes His call to return to Him. Listen to Joel 2:12ff, "'Yet even now,' says the LORD, 'return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; and rend your hearts and not your garments.' Return to the LORD, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and repents of evil."

So, speak to your family members (your children and grandchildren), your friends, neighbors, and schoolmates. Call them to Worship the LORD, while there is still time (**Hebrews 10:25**). And, pray for those who are hardened in

"I began to read several scriptures but seemed to concentrate on Philippians, chapter 2 - about Christ's humility and how he took upon himself the attitude of a servant and how he humbled himself and became obedient unto death on a cross. I was challenged with the wonder of who God really is and his sacrifice for us."

"I sat down in my room and began worshipping him as a response to those thoughts. It was then that the initial inspiration of the song came. I began, 'Light of the world, You stepped down into darkness ...' and on and on until I had two verses finished. I then put them aside."

"About six months later, I thought of the verses again and said to myself, 'I really do need to finish that song.' I began flipping through ideas of melodies and lyrics that I had written. I came across a melody that I had saved, which sounded quite simple, and yet the feeling I sensed as I played it seemed to complement my verses perfectly. I wanted the chorus to be a response to our Lord's amazing sacrifice."

"I began to ask, 'How are we going to respond to that great happening? Do we bow down? Do we scream out? How do we say, 'You are altogether lovely. You are worthy?' As I finished the song, I finally felt as if the pieces had all come together and it all was complete."

"Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." - Philippians 2:9-11

This Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday, meditate on the words of Philippians 2:9-11 above, sing the song "Here I Am to Worship," and gather weekly with the LORD's people to Worship Him.

The Evangelical Catechism Traditional Orthodox Edition of 1896

I am continuing the series of articles on the 1896 edition of the Evangelical Catechism (which is in the public domain). It has been republished (in modern English) by the Evangelical Association in 2018. This article covers the 7th of 52 weeks in the catechism. This continues the explanation of "The 10 Commandments" (weeks 3 through 13).

Week 7 is composed of questions 17 and 18.

17. What is the Fifth Commandment?

Honor your father and your mother: that your days may be long upon the land which the Lord thy God gives to you.

18. What does God require in this Commandment?

God requires that I always honor father and mother by loving, obeying and serving them, and taking care of them in sickness, need, and old age; likewise respect all who in God's providence, are my superiors. Prov. 1:8; Eph. 6:1-3; Prov. 19:26; Prov. 30:17; Heb. 13:17; Rom. 13:1; Eph. 6:5-7; Acts 5:29.

May you be blessed as you examine this founding statement of our Evangelical faith and heritage.




Maundy Thursday, April 6

Cemetery Board: Kurt reported that they are discussing white pines on the south side of the cemetery, and also a wrought iron fence.


Old Business: Betty discussed the idea of having a Welcome Bag for visitors/new members. Discussion was held regarding the Music Director update and Baltz Cemetery.


New Business
