

From the Desk of Pastor Darrell

Worship the LORD!!! Worship in Spirit and Truth

Worship Services begin with "A Call to Worship." Some of the following (in italics) is taken Z Team from "The Call To Worship," by Jarryd Foreman.

The corporate worship gathering is a vital part of the weekly rhythm within the body of Prayer List Christ. The Call to Worship urges people to turn from worldly distractions and set their minds, **Food Pantry** hearts, and attention on the glory of God.

In his book called **Christ-Centered Worship**, Bryan Chappell shows that the call to worship Care Center actually begins with God's calling us to worship Him. The Greek word Ekklesia is used in the New Testament and commonly refers to "a called out assembly or congregation." In this, the church consists of people who are called out by God into the perfect salvation He offers through the atoning work of Christ. We are a "chosen race, a royal priesthood, a people for His own possession" (1 Peter 2:5) that God has purchased, redeemed, and secured.

Before we can call God's people to worship we have to arrive at the understanding that it is initially God Himself who has called us to worship. Only through this invitation are we able to

respond as His people and "proclaim the excellencies of Him who has called us out of darkness into His marvelous light" (1 Peter 2:9). Through this realization, when we worship, we are doing what God has ultimately called us to do as His people.

God Himself calls you and me, and all who are reading this, in fact all people, everywhere to come and Worship Him. For He, the LORD alone, is God. He alone is "one God, spirit, life, light and love." He alone is "eternal, unchangeable and ever present." He alone is "true, all-knowing, all-wise, holy, almighty and just." He alone is "blessed, good, gracious and merciful." He is "one God in three persons, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit." These attributes are laid out for us in questions 6-10 of our 1929 edition of the Evangelical Catechism.

God Himself is calling you to Worship Him, even as Jesus said in John 4:23, "But the hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for such the Father seeks to worship him."

Do you hear His call? Do you hear His call as the first and most important calling upon your life - "To seek first His Kingdom and His righteousness," (Matt. 6:33 which answers the 1st question of the Evangelical Catechism. More importantly, are you answering His call by actually coming to Worship Him?

Are you a true Worshipper? Worshipping Him in spirit and in truth?

To worship Him in spirit is to have your spirit led by His Holy Spirit. For He alone can give you "a new spirit" and "a new heart" (Ezekiel 11:19, 18:31 and 36:26) that is devoted to God.

To worship Him in truth is to Worship Him according to His Word, not according to our own thoughts, ideas or traditions. The second person of the Trinity is the Word as explained in John chapter 1 "in the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God and the Word was God." And, the Word written is the Holy Scriptures, the Holy Bible.

We at Zion seek to Worship God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit in spirit and in truth. According to His calling, we call each of you reading this to come and Worship the LORD (Psalm 95).

May each of you reading this be moved by His Spirit to make His Worship the first and most important aspect of your life. May this be most certainly true! Amen and Amen!



"HOLY SPIRIT, Light Divine," by Andrew Reed (1817)



I chose this hymn for the month because we will celebrate Pentecost, the gift of the Holy Spirit (<u>Acts 2</u>), 50 days after Easter, on Sunday, May 28.

The following is taken from 101 More Hymn Stories, by Kenneth W. Osbeck, published by Kregel Publications in 1985.

The hymn was originally titled "Holy Ghost, with Light Divine." But because of the preference that many have today for the term "Holy Spirit" rather than "Holy Ghost," the hymn text has been changed in many of the present hymnals to this form, "Holy Spirit, Light Divine."

One of the marks of spiritual maturity in any believer's life is the growing awareness of the Holy Spirit's presence and power for daily living. How natural it often seems to attempt to live our lives and even minister for God in our own strength. The words of this hymn can serve as a worthy prayer for personal devotions, as we begin each new day.

"Holy Ghost, With Light Divine" has been, for many years, one of the church's important, teaching hymns regarding the Holy Spirit's ministry in a Christian's life. In a very simply-stated manner, the text tells us that we need a sensitivity to the Holy Spirit's presence, in order to have clear directions for our lives (verse one). Then, we are reminded that we need the Holy Spirit's ministry to enable us to live lives of purity and power (verse two). We also need the work of the Holy Spirit to balance the emotional sorrows of life with "joy divine" (verse three). Finally, we need the all-prevailing control by the Holy Spirit, if our lives are to be totally committed and conformed to God (verse four).

The Evangelical Catechism

I am continuing the series of articles on the 1896 edition of the Evangelical Catechism (which is in the public domain). It has been republished (in modern English) by the Evangelical Association in 2018. This article covers the 8th of 52 weeks in the catechism. This continues the explanation of "The 10 Commandments" (weeks 3 through 13).

Week 8 is composed of questions 19 through 22.

19. What is the sixth Commandment?

You shall not kill.

20. What does God forbid in this Commandment?

God forbids murder, also every deed, word and thought, whereby my own life or the life of another person is shortened or embittered. Gen. 9:6; Rom. 12:19; Matt. 5:21-22; 1 John 3:15; Matt. 5:44-45; Luke 21:34-35.

21. How is this Commandment further seriously violated?

This commandment is seriously violated when we injure the soul of another person, or our own soul by enticement or negligence. Matt. 18:6-7; Prov. 24:1-2; 2 Cor. 6:14-15.

22. What does God require in this Commandment?

God requires that we assist our neighbor in every need and aid him in his earthly life and eternal well-being on all occasions. Isa. 58:7; Heb. 13:16; 1 Peter 4:10; Eph. 4:32; Isa. 1:17; Matt. 5:7.

May you be blessed as you examine this founding statement of our Evangelical faith and heritage.
