

From the Desk of Pastor Darrell

Worship the LORD with Gladness!

Throughout this Summer (June 4 through September 3) we will gather at Zion Church Park (840 S. Jefferson) for Worship, weather permitting. June 4 is our Church in the Park (at 11:00 a.m.) and Picnic (at noon). Afterwards (starting June 11) is Worship in Park (at 9:00 a.m.). You can read more about these later in the Visitor.

In recognition of Worshipping at the Church Park, I choose the hymn "Morning Has Broken" in the next article. These joyous words, so applicable to being outdoors in the Spring and Summer, joined with its uplifting Gaelic tune, stirs the heart to joy. For it is wonderful to gather each Sunday morning at our Church Park to Worship the LORD.

Joy is the true spirit of praise and worship. This is the theme of the 100th Psalm. Indeed, the 100th Psalm is a Call for all people to come and Worship the LORD, who alone is God the Almighty, the Creator of all the heavens and earth. Read the 100th Psalm with joy in your heart, filled with reverence for the LORD "Jehovah" God.

1 "A psalm. For giving thanks. Shout for joy to the LORD, all the earth." People shout for joy to support their favorite sports teams and heroes. But, everyone is called to shout even more and louder for the LORD God.

2 "Worship the LORD with gladness; come before Him with joyful songs." We are called to Worship the LORD GOD with joyful songs, which arises from joy-filled hearts.

3 "Know that the LORD is God. It is He who made us, and we are His; we are His people, the sheep of His pasture." We are called to get to know God more and more, going from head knowledge about Him to heart knowledge of Him. For He is our Creator. And not only our Creator but our one, true Father. Indeed, we are His people. And He, as the Good Shepherd, is guiding us to His eternally green and good pasture.

4 "Enter His gates with thanksgiving and His courts with praise; give thanks to Him and praise His name." Again, we are called to come to Him – enter His gates and courts. And to do so with thanksgiving and praise.

5 "For the LORD is good and His love endures for ever; His faithfulness continues through all generations." Beyond gathering to thank and praise the LORD God for creating us and guiding us, we do so because He is good, loving and faithful to us to the end. Even when we haven't been good, loving and faithful, He is and always will be.

There is a tune titled the "Old Hundreth," dating back to the 1500s. It was used in the Genevan Psalter, for singing the 100th **<u>Psalm.</u>** We know this tune, for we sing it when we sing the "**Doxology.**"

Praise GOD, from whom all blessings flow; Praise HIM, all creatures here below; Praise HIM above, ve heav'nly host; Praise FATHER, SON, and HOLY GHOST.

So, Heed God's Call! Come and Worship Him!

Heed God's Call! Join us as we Worship Him all Summer long at Zion Church Park!

Heed God's Call! Come to Him with a heart filled with thanksgiving and praise!

Heed God's Call! Dwell on His goodness, love and faithfulness!

Heed God's Call! Let your hearts be filled with His everlasting joy!

In Songs of Praise Discussed, the editor, Percy Dearmer, explains that as there was a need for a hymn to give thanks for each day. English poet and children's author Eleanor Farjeon had been "asked to make a poem to fit the lovely Scottish tune."

The Evangelical Catechism

I am continuing the series of articles on the 1896 edition of the Evangelical Catechism (which is in the public domain). It has been republished (in modern English) by the Evangelical Association in 2018. This article covers the 9th of 52 weeks in the catechism. This continues the explanation of "The 10 Commandments" (weeks 3 through 13).

Week 9 is composed of questions 23 through 25.

23. What is the Seventh Commandment?

24. What does God forbid in this Commandment?

God forbids the breaking of the marriage vow and requires all of us to be pure in thoughts, words and deeds. Matt. 5:8; 1 Cor. 6:19-20; Prov. 4:23; 1 Cor. 3:17; Eph. 5:3-4; 1 Cor. 15:33

25. What does God require in this Commandment?

God requires that we lead a pure and modest life in body and soul, and that in marriage husband and wife faithfully love and honor each other.

May you be blessed as you examine this founding statement of our Evangelical faith and heritage.




Caprese Salad
