

From the Desk of Pastor Darrell



Reformation Sunday, October 29

The Protestant Reformation became an enduring reality on October 31, 1517 (506 years ago). On that date, Catholic Priest Martin Luther posted his protesting paper, "The 95 Theses," on the door of Castle Church in Wittenberg in Germany.

The Reformation focused on 5 basic truths: 1) It is by Grace Alone, 2) received by Faith Alone, 3) placed in Christ Alone, 4) perfectly proclaimed in Scripture Alone, 5) that we are saved (from sin and death and reconciled to God) so that we may bring God the Glory Alone.

Zion Evangelical Church traces its heritage to this Reformation. This year (October 29 Sunday Reformation Service), I'll focus on Faith Alone.

Our Evangelical Catechism (the 1896 edition) asks, "2. How can you secure the salvation of your immortal soul?" The answer given is, "We secure the salvation of our immortal soul thru faith in our Lord Jesus Christ." The following about "faith alone "is taken from the 1916 book, Evangelical Fundamentals, Part Two - Evangelical Belief and

Doctrine – The Evangelical Catechism Explained.

"Faith means confidence. Faith in Jesus Christ is the simple and sincere confidence that Jesus Christ can and will save from sin and give eternal life. We find examples of this faith in the paralytic, Matt. 9:2 ("behold, some people brought to him a paralytic, lying on a bed. And when Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralytic, 'Take heart, my son; your sins are forgiven." - the friends of the paralytic wouldn't let the crowd or even the roof stand in the way of bringing their paralytic friend to Jesus for healing); the centurion, Matt. 8:5 -10 ("When he (Jesus) had entered Capernaum, a centurion came forward to him, appealing to him ... When Jesus heard this, he marveled and said to those who followed him, 'Truly, I tell you, with no one in Israel have I found such faith." - for the centurion believed without having to see the miracle done); the Canaanite woman, Matt. 15:22-28 ("behold, a Canaanite woman from that region came out and was crying, 'Have mercy on me, O Lord, Son of David; my daughter is severely oppressed by a demon.' ... Then Jesus answered her, 'O woman, great is your faith! Be it done for you as you desire.' And her daughter was healed instantly." - even when Jesus effectively told her no, she still believed), and in Martha, John 11:27 ("She said to him, 'Yes, Lord; I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, who is coming into the world." - then Jesus raised her brother Lazarus from the dead). Such a faith receives the assurance "Thy sins are forgiven thee" and the strength to begin a new and better life."

"To believe in the way of merely regarding as true, is to have only the outward form of a faith that is dead in itself, James 2:17 ("So also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead."). True faith makes the believer bet-

ter: a dead faith leaves him as he is."

On Reformation Sunday, October 29, I will focus on the message of "Faith and Salvation." I will turn to 1 Peter 1:3-9 and its message in vs 5, "through faith for salvation." and vs 9, "the outcome of your faith, the salvation of your souls." So, join us, and allow God's Word and Spirit to grow and strengthen your Faith. Also, look over this month's song, "My Faith

Looks Up to Thee."

May the Blessings of a living and enduring Faith in Jesus Christ be yours; Pastor Darrell

This "hymn which encourages our faith to look up to Jesus, the author and finisher of that faith. ... The text was written by Ray Palmer. ... he was a member of the Park St. Congregational Church. Later, he decided to become a minister."

"One evening during the fall while studying and translating some German poetry, Palmer penned this poem. ... It was never intended for publication but for private devotion. However, a couple of years later, he made a return visit to Boston and ran into his old friend from Park St. Congregational Church, composer Lowell Mason (1792-1872). Mason was publishing a hymnbook and asked Palmer to give him something for it. Palmer pulled out the notebook and showed Mason the verses that he had already set down. The two men stepped into a nearby drug store so that Mason could jot down a copy. That very night, Mason composed the tune (Olivet)."

"Mason was so excited about it that when he saw Palmer again a couple of days later, he said, 'Mr. Palmer, you may live many years and do many good things, but I think you will be best known to posterity as the author of 'My Faith Looks Up To Thee." Mason was right about Palmer. He is best known today as the author of this much-sung hymn."

"... It is well remembered that when writing the last line, 'a ransomed soul,' the thought that the whole work of redemption and salvation was involved in those words, and suggested the theme of eternal redemption, moved the writer to a degree of emotion that brought abundant tears."

The Evangelical Catechism

I am continuing the series of articles on the 1896 edition of the Evangelical Catechism (which is in the public domain). It has been republished (in modern English) by the Evangelical Association in 2018. This article covers the 11^{th} of 52 weeks in the catechism. This continues the explanation of "The 10 Commandments" (weeks 3 through 13).

- Week 12 is composed of questions 32 through 34.
- 29. What is the Tenth Commandment?
- You shall not covet thy neighbor's house; you shall not covet your neighbor's wife, nor his manservant, nor his maidservant, nor his ox, nor his donkey, nor anything that is vour neighbor's.
- 30. What does God forbid in this Commandment?
 - God forbids all evil lusts and desires for wrongful possession or enjoyment. James 1:14-15;



Rom. 6:12; I John 2:15-17 31. What does God require in this Commandment? *God requires that we have joy in Him*

and in His holy providence. Ps. 37:4; Rom. 7:22; Prov. 23:26 May you be blessed as you examine

this founding statement of our Evangelical faith and heritage.


Daylight Savings Time Ends on November 5






