

This spirit of perpetual gratitude is clearly evidenced throughout this hymn."

Keep this hymn in your heart and on your tongue as you go through the month of November, and especially on Thanksgiving day.

Calling All Zion Members


Calling all Zion members!

The Evangelical Catechism

I am continuing the series of articles on the 1896 edition of the Evangelical Catechism (which is in the public domain). It has been republished (in modern English) by the Evangelical Association in 2018. This article covers the 13th of 52 weeks in the catechism. This concludes the explanation of "The 10 Commandments" (weeks 3 through 13). These questions express the summary and curse of the 10 Commandments and the blessing of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Week 13 is composed of questions 35 through 39.

35. What is the summary of the Ten Commandments?

You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength (Deut. 6:5). You shall love your neighbor as yourself (Lev. 19:18) On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets (Matt. 22:40).

36. What does God declare concerning these Commandments?

God says: "Cursed be he who does not confirm all the words of this law by doing them." (Deut. 27:26; Gal. 3:10). "You shall therefore keep my statutes. And my ordinances by doing which you shall live: I am the LORD." (Lev. 18:5; Luke 10:28).





NEW BUSINESS:


