The Passion of CHRIST

Throughout the Lenten season we focus on the "Passion of Christ" - highlighted by his suffering and death on the cross. Many of the hymns of this season have a somber mood and tempo to draw us into the sufferings of CHRIST, such as "Were You There?" below.

These kinds of hymns are a stark reminder of the terrible price that Jesus paid for us to be reconciled to His Father - "knowing that you were ransomed from the futile ways inherited from your forefathers, not with perishable things such as silver or gold, but with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb with-

out blemish or spot" (1Peter 1:18-19, ESV).

These kinds of hymns aren't designed to draw us down to despair, nor are they given to beat us over the head with our sin, faults, and guilt. Instead, they are to stir us up to devotion to the one who loved us so much that He willingly died for us - "but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8, ESV).

In fact, the Scriptures declare that Jesus joyously bore the cross for us — "who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God" (Hebrews 12:2b, ESV).

Therefore, "let us run with endurance the race that is set before us" (Hebrews 12:1b ESV) - this life which includes trials, tribulations, suffering, and death. And as we do, "looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith" (Hebrews 12:2a ESV). That is keep your eyes on Jesus.

So throughout this Lenten season I pray these words of Ephesians 3:17-19 (ESV) over each person who reads this:

"That Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith,"

"That you, being rooted and grounded in love, may have strength to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth" of His love,

That you may "know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge,"

And "that you may be filled with all the fullness of God."

Suffering is something we all must endure; the tool unwillingly used to strengthen ourselves in various areas of life. Greatest of all forms of suffering is suffering for God – that is, to use our suffering to learn how to rely on His strength rather than ours. Were You There is the product of men and women who used their suffering for just that.

Were You There is one of the most famous Spirituals: Biblical songs created by African slaves in America. Slaves could have blamed their woes on God – and surely, some did – but many chose to draw closer to Him, desperate for the hope only He can give. Men can take away many freedoms, but the freedom to seek after God is something that can never be stolen.

Spirituals were created by those slaves who longed for God, utilizing music to spread Biblical themes and stories. Indeed, storytelling and preaching are powerful methods, but music is the premier tool to weave themes and stories into the mind and soul. Through this tool, slaves of that age ended up creating two genres of music that forever changed American music. In the fields the songs were often sung in a somber and mournful way; thus began the blues style. In the church, the songs were sung in an uplifting and joyful way; thus began the gospel music style. Here lies the beauty of Spirituals: the product of a unified group that suffered together and praised God all the more for it.

Were You There falls into the blues category. The purpose of the lyrics is to recall the suffering Christ endured, which serves to remind that suffering in God's eyes is not the lot of the cursed, but the blessed. It is a message we must hold fast to when we ourselves are called to suffer, an inevitability of the Christian walk.

"Therefore, since Christ suffered in His body, arm yourselves also with the same attitude, because whoever suffers in the body is done with \sin " – $\frac{1 \text{ Peter 4:1}}{1 \text{ Peter 4:1}}$.



The Evangelical Catechism **Traditional Orthodox Edition of 1896**

I am continuing the series of articles on the 1896 edition of the Evangelical Catechism, republished in modern English by the Evangelical Association in 2018. This article covers the 17th of 52 weeks in the catechism. This continues the section on the Christian Faith. Weeks 14 through 19 focus on describing God's character and nature.

Week 17 is composed of questions 48 and 49.

48. What is the meaning of: God is omnipotent?

All things are made and sustained by God; He can do and create whatsoever He will. Isaiah 40:26; Ps. 115:3; Luke 1:37; Ps. 33:8-9; Gen. 17:1

49. What is the meaning of: God is just?

God is just in all His ways; He deals with every one according to his needs; He rewards the good and punishes the evil. Ps. 145:17; Rom. 2:6-8; Ps. 103:6; Isaiah 41:10; Ps. 37:25; Matt. 5:12; Ps. 5:4; 1 John 2:29 May you be blessed as you examine this founding statement of our Evangelical faith and heritage.



Continuing Lenten Schedule

We are in the final month of the Lenten Season, which finishes up with Easter on March 31. We are continuing with Jesus' "I Am" statements in the Gospel of John. Through these bold statements, we will come to know Jesus (who He is and what He has done) more fully. The remaining Lenten schedule is listed below:

During Lent, we are vividly reminded of Jesus' Sacrificial death. As Phil. 2:5-8, states, "Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus: Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, but made himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself and became obedient to death — even death on a cross!"

Through Jesus' sacrificial death, our (that is everyone who places their faith in Jesus) sins are forgiven, and we are made right with God, as Eph. 1:7 says, "In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace."

We make this special point to lift up Jesus' Sacrifice for three reasons. First, to call all people, Christians and non-Christians, to face their sins (Confess them) and to change their ways from wrong to right (Repent of their sins). Second, to call those who have never invited Jesus Christ into their lives to do so now (by Faith, trusting in Jesus to truly forgive their sins). And **Third**, to call us to actively follow Jesus (live a good life for Him by the power of the Holy Spirit) and serve Jesus (build His Church by the power of the Holy Spirit, using our abilities to bring others to Christ and meet their needs).

Therefore, these Lenten services are really a Crusade for Christ, kind of like a Billy-Graham Crusade. So, I encourage you, young and old, to come. And I encourage you to invite your relatives, neighbors, school friends, and coworkers to come. For (Rev. 22:17), "The Spirit and the bride say, 'Come!' And let him who hears say, 'Come!' Whoever is thirsty, let him come; and whoever wishes, let him take the free gift of the water of life."

Note: We will not have any Lenten meals on March 6, 13, or 20. Our final Lenten meal will be served by the Sisters in Faith on Maundy Thursday, March 28.


Confirmation Schedule


Our confirmation schedule is listed below. Please keep Katelyn Allen, Wesley Hale, Josephina Riemann and Ella Weaver in your prayers.

Council Meeting February 12, 2024

COUNCIL Council members present were Vice-President Annette Hund, Sherry Wynn, Betty Ann Keller Timmer, Darren Doerr,

Joshua Seidlitz, Andrew Taake, Kurt Tegtmeier, and Office Administrator Amanda Frierdich. Pastor Darrell Weber joined the meeting at 8:30. Annette called the meeting to order at 8:00 p.m.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Amanda had emailed copies of the Treasurer's Report and Missions Report to members prior to the meeting, and copies of both were also available at the meeting. Treasurer Barb Scharf had asked Amanda a question prior to the meeting concerning the budgeted amounts by accounts. Amanda explained that the Church Windows program divides the budgeted numbers evenly over 12 months, even though some months may actually have expenses for the quarter. Maintenance expenses were higher than budgeted in January because the fire extinguishers had been inspected, some light bulbs in the exit signs had been replaced, and the quarterly boiler maintenance had been done. A motion was made by Andrew to approve the Treasurer's Report, and seconded by Sherry; motion carried. Amanda suggested setting-up direct deposit for employee payroll. Before leaving the meeting, Amanda stated that she had taken the Baby Bottles to the bank today, and she'll have the total for Life Network available

BCE Report: Pastor Darrell reported that the BCE did not meet in January.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: The December 11, 2023 and January 8, 2024 minutes were reviewed by Council. A motion was made by Sherry and seconded by Josh to approve the minutes; motion carried.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Darrell had sent his Pastor's Report of his activities for the previous month to Council members. Pastor thanked Zion's Council and Sisters-in-Faith, Clark Ferry, Patti French, and Dave Woehlke for their help with Bill Savering's ordination on January 14. Six Evangelical Association pastors and two EA licensed pastors attended. The annual congregation meeting on January 21 tasked the Council with exploring the additional option for a floor scrubber for the Fellowship Hall. Lenten meals will be on February 14 (Council), February 21 (Z-Team) and March 28 (Sisters-in-Faith). Lenten services will remain at 7:00 p.m. Pastor has worked on scheduling the Community Cross Walk for Good Friday (March 29), with the Rev. Joan Meier, Deacon Bill Mueller, Mr. Jim Jarvis, Mrs. Elle Heiligenstein, Father Marvin Volk and Pastor Matt Friz joining him as the cross is carried through Millstadt. Our four confirmands are working on a joint Confirmation Project and their presentation, which will take place on March 17. The Rite of Confirmation will take place on Palm Sunday (March 24) and their First Communion will be during the 10:00 a.m. Easter service on March 31. Pastor has given us a date for his last Sunday prior to retirement of June 8, 2025. A motion was made by Andrew, and seconded by Darren, to accept Pastor Darrell's report; motion carried.

RENEWING ZION CHURCH: No report at this time.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Audit & Budget. (Barb Scharf). No report at this time.

Long Range Ministry (Andrew Taake). Andrew has been brainstorming for ideas on what can be done as a church. He is looking at a corn hole tournament in the Church Park. He is checking if there is interest in such an event. He suggests that at least one person per team be a Zion member.

Missions & Outreach. (Betty Keller Timmer). Amanda had distributed the 2024 mission report, which showed that we had a balance of \$3,554. Donations for missions in January totaled \$985.

Staff/Parish Relations. (Darren Doerr). Darren reported that he had met with a potential custodian, who showed interest in the job; this person is currently cleaning three other churches. Darren is waiting to meet with two other potential candidates.

Property & Long Range. (Josh Seidlitz). Josh has been checking with Pastor Darrell on any problems with the building. The Z-Team had found a faucet leak outside on the east side of the Educational Building. In another issue, water has been accumulating on the roof, and the Z-Team will take care of this later by tarring the crack.

Annette had tried to contact Mike Germann, who had done research on getting a floor scrubber, but had been unable to reach him. Sherry called Kurt Pellmann, who explained that he had spoken to Mike about the scrubber. Mike had not received the information from Kurt Tegtmeier on the smaller machine, and was going to order the original scrubber for \$5,999.

Volunteer Ministries. (Sherry Wynn). Sherry will be contacting past Council members to be ushers at Sunrise Service on Easter Sunday.

Worship & Music. (Annette Hund). No report at this time. Cemetery Board. (Kurt Tegtmeier). No report at this time.

OLD BUSINESS:

Lenten Meals. Council reviewed plans for the Ash Wednesday meal

Trivia Night Preparation: Council members will be distributing flyers for the Zion trivia night at other area trivia's.

NEW BUSINESS:

Usher Duties. Council reviewed duties: Prior to the start of worship, the head usher is to make sure programs/bulletins are at both entrances and are distributed, and that the candles are lit. During the service, the head usher is to count the attendance. Following the service, the head usher checks that all doors are locked, and makes sure the cash offering is taken to the bank.


