Dear Members of Zion: January 21st, 2018

The theme verse for Zion in 2017 was (from <u>Genesis 12:2-3</u>), "*Blessed to be a Blessing*." Our congregation was Blessed in many ways this past year:

- Our new Pictorial Directory, thanks to the efforts of: Jessi Doerr and Marcia Twellman.
- General Fund was about \$5,000 under budget and giving was about \$11,000 over budget, which gave us a surplus of about \$16,000.
- Another year of strong Missions Giving, as can be seen in the enclosed Missions Committee Year End Report.

- All of our Fund Raising efforts the Trivia Night, Garage Sale, Homecoming Stand and Wurstmarkt.
- Our Christian Education our teachers, youth helpers, and children, youth and adults in Sunday School, Vacation Bible School and Youth Group.
- Redecoration of Riess Hall, which includes the Tree of Zion's Life, Pictures of our 3 Church Buildings, a new Coffee Bar, etc.

Note: In the coming year we are planning to do major renovations of our Kitchen, Fellowship Hall and the downstairs Men's Restrooms.

We also have challenges ahead, which need our prayers and participation. These include:

- The unexpected decline in our attendance by about 10%.
- The decline of our music ministries the loss of our Bell Choir in 2016, and the loss of our ZQ and Chancel Choirs in 2017, plus the weakness of our Cherub and ROC Choirs.

Christian Education Report

Our Board of Christian Education (*Krista Gruenewald*, *Lori Mercurio* and *Connie Kinder*) along with many volunteers pulled us together to make for a very positive year.

Sunday School

In May we concluded the 2016-2017 Sunday School year with the theme "**Put on the Full Armor of God**," based on **Ephesians 6:11ff**. We had a demonstration of the pieces of armor that a Roman soldier wore. And each month we have had a craft project that focused on a particular piece of armor – a sword, a shield, and a breastplate. We had 43 children and youth show up more than 3 times, with an average Sunday attendance of 30.0 for the year (compared to 48 children and an average of 31 for the previous year). And, we had 22 with faithful attendance (up 2 from the previous year).

This September we kicked off the new Sunday School year with the theme "The Fruit of the Spirit," based on <u>Galatians 5:22ff</u>. We have had a fruit of the month (Strawberries for Love in September, Oranges for Joy in October, Pears for Peace in November and Pineapples for Patience in December) along with songs and other activities. We have 39 children and youth with an average of 31.5 for September thru December (compared to 43 children and an average of 35.4 for the previous Fall). So far we have 28 with faithful attendance (down 1 from the previous year)..

Also a special thanks to the many who are providing donuts, cookies, etc. for the children and youth after the SS hour is finished.

And a special thanks to *Kelly Riemann* and *Stacy Woehlke* and our Sunday School children and youth for all of their time and effort in doing such a wonderful Sunday School Christmas program "**The Donkey in the Living Room**" (on Dec. 10th).

Confirmation

We continue to use <u>The Journey</u> confirmation material from the Evangelical Covenant Church (http://www.covchurch.org). It is a 2-year study of the Bible. The first year covers the Old Tstament and the second year covers the New Testament.

In 2017 we confirmed 3 youth – *Dylan Buecher*, *Connor Fox & Darren Gruenewald*. The 2018 (2) - *Maddie Kinder & Mari Pellmann*, and 2019 (3) – *Evan Arnold*, *Logan Fox & Max Holmes*, classes are small.

Vacation Bible School

Our Passport to Peru VBS (June 5th thru 9th) was a great success. We had 54 children, 27 youth, and 23 adults. We raised \$301.25 for drilling fresh water wells in Peru thru Group's Operation Kid-2-Kid.

Preschool Report

Zion's Christian preschool is in its 15th year of existence, as of the 2017-20187 school year. We meet Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 8:15 to 11:15 am.

In 2016-2017 we had 4-3 year olds and 9-4 year olds, for a total of 13 preschoolers. And, this year we have 11-3 year olds and 7-4 year olds, for a total of 18 preschoolers. We are excited with the turn around and growth in the size of our preschool.

Sheila Peters is our preschool teacher and has been with us for a number of years. She is a certified teacher and has many years of experience that she brings to our program. Also, she is very active in her church, First Baptist of Columbia, where her husband is the senior pastor, and she is able to communicate her Christian faith and knowledge to our children in a way that they understand. In addition, she is a substitute teacher at MCS. Our aide is *Tina Maeder*, who has been doing a wonderful job with the children. She is a valued part of our program.

Themes are used to reinforce teaching methods such as using visual aids to help the children understand each theme better. The children continue to use their listening center to follow along with the books. This helps them learn letter and word recognition. The children also learn rhymes that help with memorization. They have also enjoyed participation in Show and Tell. This helps them become comfortable explaining things and speaking in front of others. The children continue to study the alphabet weekly and continue to develop their fine and gross motor skills as well as their social skills. The children also enjoy sanctuary time, which includes music as well as a Bible lesson and prayer every time they meet.

The 2017-2018 preschoolers enjoyed field trips to the Fire Station during Fire Safety week in October and a trip Braeutigam's Pumpkin Farm during their annual Harvest Party. We also held our annual Fall Harvest Party at the end of October, our Thanksgiving feast with all the trimmings in November and in December the children participated in a Christmas program with a special visitor from the North Pole. The 2016-2017 class enjoyed their Valentine's party sharing valentines with the classmates and of course the special treats, an Easter egg hunt, the Graduation Ceremony, and a year-end Luau party outside which included crafts, digging for treasures and treats!

Our prayer is that this program helps each child to grow strong in their knowledge of the Jesus from an early age. Our program truly is an ongoing outreach and witness to our community.
