

January 31st, 2021

The Covid-19 pandemic and restrictions disrupted many of the worship services, fellowships, and ministries of our congregation from March 15<sup>th</sup> onwards last year. Yet we have carried on.

The online Streaming of our Worship services (which began back in 2016) enabled many more people to participate. We encountered problems with Spectrum/Charter Internet, causing the video to be choppy, and we have made improvements.

Up through March  $15^{th}$  (before the restrictions), the 11 Worship services averaged 88 /15 people in the sanctuary / online streaming. And the 3 Lenten services averaged 38 / 6.

From March 16<sup>th</sup> through May 24<sup>th</sup>, we were under the restrictions of not having the church or sanctuary open. So, all our Worship services were online only. The 9 Sunday services averaged 61 online streaming views, and the Easter services had 155 views. The remaining 3 Lenten services plus the 6 special Holy Week messages average 32 online streaming views.

From May 31<sup>st</sup> through November 8<sup>th</sup> (except for November 1<sup>st</sup>) we held 23 Worship services at our Church Park. A special thanks to the work of our Z-Team this year as well as in past years to make our Park so beautiful and usable. In the 23 Sundays there we averaged 77 people. The Park services were video recorded (except for 2 where the video camera quit because the battery was run down) and uploaded for later viewing. Those averaged 8 online views.

The Park services were so successful (only 1 was threatened by rain, and 3 others it was cold), that many of our members have requested that we hold Worship at the Park all summer long next year – COVID-19 or not.

And, from November 1<sup>st</sup> till the end of the year we were back in the sanctuary. We asked people to social distance (every other pew) and made masks and hand sanitizer available. We also ran audio and video cables downstairs to the projector and sound system in Fellowship Hall. So, for the 7 Sunday services we averaged 61 /35 in the sanctuary, balcony and basement / online.

Thanks to the leadership of Kelly Riemann, Stacy Woehlke and Jeri Arnold, our video Sunday School Christmas Program was produced. We had 78 /140 in the sanctuary / viewing online.

And, on Christmas Eve we added an 11:00 p.m. service so more could attend. Between the 2 services we had 100 / 75.

Our Sunday School was shut down on March 22<sup>nd</sup> and we delayed Rally day almost a month, till October 4<sup>th</sup>. Below is a table of average Sunday School attendance last year.

Aubrey Weaver was our only Confirmand in 2020. She presented her faith statement online and had 72 online views. Our 2020-2021 Confirmation class started on September 13<sup>th</sup>, with 4 7<sup>th</sup> graders and 3 8<sup>th</sup> graders.

Likewise, our Monday-Wednesday-Friday Christian Preschool was shut down on March 16<sup>th</sup>. We had 18 3- and 4-year-olds in our school. Finally, on July 10<sup>th</sup> we held a socially distanced graduation service. There were 10 preschoolers and 20 adults in attendance, and the service graduation was viewed by 76 people.

The 2020-2021 PreSchool started on September 9<sup>th</sup> with a maximum of 12 preschoolers. A few times, either our teacher or one of the preschoolers were quarantined due to exposure to someone with the Coronavirus. Thankfully, no one became seriously ill.

## Pastor's Report

Our Youth Fellowships, Z-Team, Sisters-in-Faith, Quilters, and Adult Bible studies have been disrupted numerous times because of Covid-19. As of this writing, only the Tuesday morning Z-Team and Wednesday evening Bible Study continue, albeit with smaller numbers.

Worship services at Millstadt's Garden Place and the New Athens Home for the aged, and Bible studies at Garden Place and Millstadt's Senior Center, were suspended in March. And Nursing Home, Care facilities, Rehab centers, and Retirement communities have pretty much closed their doors to visitors, including myself as Pastor, to keep their residents safe and healthy.

Thankfully 2 of our Sisters-in-Faith members, Patti French and Barb Savering, began sending and delivering cards and sometimes gifts to our members in these places, as well as older members in their own homes. In addition, they have sent cards and gifts to our High School and College youth, as well as to our teachers and public-school teachers as well.

The Millstadt Community Choir 4th of July and Christmas concerts were cancelled.

The May Yard-Sale, Homecoming Stand, and September BBQ Fund-raisers were cancelled. However, we went ahead with a drive thru pick-up Wurstmarkt, which turned out to sell more meals in 2020 than in 2019.

Despite all the cancellations, our members, and even non-member friends supported Zion with their gifts of time, talents, and treasures. So much so, that giving to Zion was higher in 2020 than it was in 2019.

Amidst all the gloomy news and forecasts, the restrictions, and cancellations, we, Christ's people at Zion, are persevering and carrying on. We are finding ways to share the Good News of Jesus Christ, and to comfort and encourage people in His name.

Indeed, the light of Jesus Christ shines into the darkness of man's sin, sorrows and sufferings, and the darkness cannot overcome His light (based on <u>John 1:5</u>). Therefore, Jesus calls you and me to be bear His light to those around us. "You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hid. Nor do men light a lamp and put it under a bushel, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house. Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven." (Matthew 5:14-16).

So, as we move into the new and uncertain year, "Let us not grow weary in well-doing, for in due season we shall reap if we do not lose heart. So then, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all men, and especially to those who are of the household of faith." (Galatians 6:9-10).

#### Zion Evangelical Annual Congregational Meeting

#### January 26, 2020

Zion Evangelical Church held its Annual Meeting on 01/26/20 following the church service. Council President, Stacy Woehlke called the meeting to order with 53 members present. Pastor Darrell Weber opened with a prayer. All members present received the Annual Report for reference.

Linda Hopfinger moved and Vicki Pellmann seconded the motion to accept the minutes of the January 20, 2019, Annual Meeting as presented. Motion carried.

Rick Holmes speaking on behalf of the audit committee consisting of Rick, Andrew Taake, and Ray Hohlt reported that an audit of the books was completed on January 22, 2020. Rick reported the church records were in order. Joyce Tastad moved to accept the audit report and Rick Holmes seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Members were given the opportunity to review the Treasurer's Report. Kelly Rieman questioned why there was \$420,006.74 in the Miscellaneous Fund. Pastor Darrell Weber explained that was money received from the Marilyn Fischer Estate that had not yet been transferred to the money market fund. Bill Savering motioned to accept the Treasurer's Report and Dave Woehlke seconded the motion. Motion carried.

President Stacy Woehlke noted there is \$3,059.08 in interest money from the In Living Trust Window Fund. Council recommended that money be used to repair the damage done in the Pie Room from water damage. Dave Woehlke made a motion to use the money for the Pie Room repairs and Joyce Tastad seconded the motion. Motion carried.

#### Old Business:

Pastor updated the members on the Carillon System. Mike Germann checked the system and concluded the speaker and amplifier were in good shape, just the box would need to be replaced. The congregation previously approved to spend up to \$11,000 for repairs to the Carillon System. Pastor Darrell received a bid from the Vernin Company for \$7,708.50 to replace the box. The money from the Marilyn Fischer Estate would cover the cost.

Dave Woehlke reported receiving a bid from Moore Asphalt for \$78,275 to remove all debris off site, add 8 inches of rock, grate & roll, remove tree, address window wells, and lay 2 ½ inches of asphalt. Striping the parking lot would be a separate expense. Earl Doerr asked if other bids would be sought or to just allow Moore Asphalt to do the work. Rick Holmes advised he believes this bid is at a discounted rate. Earl also advised a building permit would have to be secured and a variance requested. Tracy Holmes advised that the church would have to ask to be removed from the Commercial Design Ordinance. This would be handled through the Zoning Board. Discussion was held that the paved lot would benefit anyone needing to use a wheelchair, cane, etc., the parking would be better organized,

and it would help keep dirt from being brought into the church. Helen Vigna discussed the priority of paving the parking lot versus replacing the elevator. Pastor Darrell believes the elevator would be quite expensive and there would be involved with regard to where to put the elevator. Charlotte Mehrtens made a motion to have the parking lot paved and Ray Hohlt seconded the motion. Motion carried.

#### **New Business:**

Earl Doerr updated the members on the current projects the Z-Team will be working on:

- 1) Women's downstairs bathroom-new floor and plastering
- 2) Music Room-new ceiling due to water damage, repair doorway, and put up new shelves
- 3) Closest under the steps (old coal room)-new floor

Jessie Doerr asked to put in a baby changing table in the bathroom.

Discussion was held on how these projects would be funded. Pastor Darrell stated there is \$5,670 in the maintenance and care fund. Sisters In Faith asked the Z-Team to give them an estimate as they may be able to help out.

Pastor Darrell advised Kerry Burnette has moved out of the parsonage to pursue a job in Kansas City and asked for any volunteers to help clean out the parsonage. The Board of Christian Education will be working on a plan for the youth. A new youth minister will not be hired due to finances.

Rich Trent made a motion to adjourn and Bill Savering seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Pastor Darrell closed with the Lord's Prayer.

#### **Proposed Constitutional Changes**

1. Article on the "Dissolution of Congregation"

#### **ARTICLE X - PROPERTY**

122. In case of division in the membership of the congregation, it takes two-thirds (2/3) majority to submit the question of the right to the property to an unbiased mediator and the decision of said judiciary shall be binding on all members of the congregation. In case of dissolution of the congregation, the title to property shall vest in the Village of Millstadt. its assets and all property and interests which it will possess, including any devise, bequest, gift or grant contained in any will or other instrument, in trust or otherwise made before or after such dissolution, will be liquidated in the following manner: 1) all outstanding financial debts and obligations will be faithfully honored and settled; 2) all remaining assets will be distributed as determined by the church council and approved by a majority vote of the congregation at a duly called congregational meeting; 3) distribution of the remaining assets will not benefit any private, personal or selfish purpose but will be transferred to a non-profit organization.

#### **SECTION 8. COUNCIL**

D: The Council shall direct the Senior Pastor to keep a complete record of baptisms, confirmations, marriages and deaths. All records shall be property of the church and as such are open to inspection by regular constituted authorities of the church. Upon dissolution of the congregation, its records shall become property of the Village of Millstadt St. Clair County Historical Society.

2. Article on the number of Members on the Church Council

#### ARTICLE VIII - THE COUNCIL

116. The Council shall be composed of nine (9) members, along with the Senior Pastor, Pastor or Minister of Christian Education and Treasurer serving as ex-officio members. It shall have jurisdiction and oversight of the congregation and all its organizations. Five (5) members shall constitute a quorum. It shall organize as provided for in the by-laws.

#### SECTION 8. COUNCIL

A: The administration of the congregation is vested in the Council. The Council is composed of nine (9) members, along with the Senior Pastor, Pastor or Minister of Christian Education and Treasurer as ex-officio members.
