



Pastor's Report

Dear Members and Friends of Jesus Christ and of Zion:

As we all know, 2021 was the second year (and a full year) dealing with Covid-19 (sickness, suffering, fears, deaths, and restrictions).

As followers of Jesus Christ, we are called upon to face all adversity (trials and troubles) with steadfastness and perseverance. Take hold of these Scripture passages:

1 Corinthians 15:58 "Therefore, my beloved brothers, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain."

Hebrews 12:1 "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us."

The LORD God calls upon you and me to "abound in the work of the Lord" and to "run the race that is set before us." Indeed, we at Zion have been doing so this past year.

Our Worship services in the Sanctuary were very limited in 2020 but expanded in 2021 with an average Sunday Attendance of 67. We continued Worship in the Church Park throughout the Summer and Fall (June 6 through October 10). And we had a great turnout of 180 at our Christmas Eve service.

Our Sunday School was in session January through May and September through December, averaging 16½ children each Sunday. Our Adult Bible Studies resumed on Sundays with Sean Mahoney teaching That The World May Know and on Wednesdays at Zion covering the Letters of Peter and Jude. Our Preschool started the year with limited enrollment, but by the Fall we were back up to 18 3- and 4-year-olds being taught by Sheila Peters and Tina Maeder.

Garden Place and the Senior Center opened back up allowing in-person visitors and services. On the 2nd and 4th Mondays at the Senior Center, there is a Bible study led by *Pat Morris* and Pastor Darrell. On Tuesdays there is a Bible Study at Garden Place covering the Gospel of Matthew. And on the second Thursday of the month, we have a Worship Service at Garden Place that includes Holy Communion and is accompanied by organist *Ken Allen*.

Giving from our members and friends enabled Zion to operate in the black this year without the aid of the government Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) Loan that we used in 2020 (that was forgiven). Our Missions giving continued to be strong. For example, in 2020 we collected 84 Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes and paid the \$9 shipping charge. In 2021 we collected and paid shipping for 124 Shoeboxes.

Our Z-team, Sisters-in-Faith, Quilters, and by the end of the year, our Youth Group were all actively meeting in-person and working together for the good of our church and community.

By June we restarted our fund-raising efforts. We had the big community Garage Sale on June 5, which is greatly supported by our Z-Team men and women. We had the Corn Dog and Funnel Cake Stand at the Millstadt Homecoming on September 3 and 4. And we had the drive-by-Wurstmarkt on November 13. Many of our members, especially older ones, participated.

Our Prayer ministry has been more active than ever. We continually receive phone calls, text messages and e-mails with prayer requests from members, friends, neighbors and even strangers. We are known as the Praying Church. Indeed there are so many things and illnesses happening that cause many of us to be anxious. But we seek to heed the Lord's call – (Philippians 4:6-7) "Have no anxiety about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which passes all understanding, will keep your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

Pastor's Report

On March 31 we held a retirement party for *Darlene Gansmann*, our Church Secretary for the past 10 years. As a congregation we combined the Secretary (*Darlene*) and Treasurer (*Vicki Pellmann*) positions into an Office Administrator / Financial Treasurer position. *Darlene* and *Vicki* brought so much more to our church and office with their friendly welcoming smiles and personalities.

On March 4, we called *Pam Gowens* who had 25 years of experience with Nestle Purina and 5 years of experience with the Waldinger Corporation. She fit in right away and was friendly to all who called and visited as well.

By the Fall Pam was feeling ill more and more, but her doctor really didn't have an answer. Then on December 18, the day after our Staff Christmas Luncheon, she was admitted to Saint Louis University Hospital. Soon after, she was in the ICU and placed on a ventilator. After 3 weeks of struggle, she passed away in the early morning hours of January 4, with her husband, *Mike*, and daughters, *Kelly* and *Jamie*, at her side. We join them in their grief and loss.

A special thanks to *Darlene* for coming back to help us with our Secretarial work (bulletins, Visitor, annual report, etc.) and for Council member *Rich Hoffelmeyer* who has been working on our financial records as well as paying bills and working with Illinois and Federal IRS. Note: We have already begun a search for an Office Administrator.

These are some of the ways we steadfastly persevered and overcame in 2021. But now our sights are fixed upon what the Lord has before us in this new year of 2022.

We are never to be content with merely existing. We are to forge on in becoming alive in Christ and reaching others for Him (Matthew 28:19-20 – "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age.")

With this in mind, we seek to renew and revitalize our congregation and our worship. We are seeking to actively engage our children, youth and younger families and call them to Worship and Serve Jesus Christ with us. With the help of Darren & Jessi Doerr, Kimberly Gibson and other parents, we seek to rebuild and expand our ministries to children and youth. With Josh Seidlitz and Jessi Seidlitz, we seek to connect with our pre-college youth and college young adults.

Also, we seek to revitalize Special Music in our Worship Service by calling upon our own "younger" members and others to utilize and share their gifts for Praising the Lord.

We will also foster more Church Fellowship with the return of Game/TV nights and Christian Movie nights on the 4th Friday of the month (excluding Summer), the return of a Family Night (April 3), and the return of the Lenten Fellowship meals before the Lenten Services (which begins on March 2).

For any of these things to happen requires us to "Draw near to God and He will draw near to us," (James 4:8). This requires us to "Pray at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints" (Ephesians 6:18). This requires us to "be doers of the Word, and not hearers only."

Therefore, this report is really an appeal to the hearts, minds and souls of each person hearing or reading this.

So, O Lord Jesus, I pray that you would give more and more of us eyes to see You, ears to hear You, and hearts to respond to You so that we may speak of You and share You with all with whom we come into contact. Enable these efforts to become effective and fruitful, for your glory, by the indwelling power of Your Holy Spirit. Make this sure to be, so that we, Zion and its members, may have a future and a hope. Amen!

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Zion Evangelical Congregational Meeting January 31, 2021

Meeting called to order at 11:05 a.m. by President Dale Gruenewald. There were 45 members in attendance. Pastor opened with a prayer.

Minutes for 2020: Minutes from the January 26 Annual Congregational Meeting were reviewed. Rich Hoffelmeyer motioned to approve the minutes; Vicki Pellmann seconded. Motion carried.

Minutes from the November 15 Annual Fall Congregational Meeting were reviewed. Dave Woehlke motioned to approve the minutes; Kathi Trent seconded. Motion carried.

Audit Report: Audit report reviewed. Les Mehrtens acknowledged that a lot of time was spent on the audit but that the time was well spent. He also thanked Vicki Pellmann for her time in facilitating the process. Les Mehrtens motioned to approve the audit report; Joyce Tastad seconded. Motion carried

2021 Budget: Budget was reviewed. Rich Hoffelmeyer pointed out mileage allowance had dropped and Vicki Pellmann made note to adjust. Rich Hoffelmeyer motioned to approve the budget; Linda Hopfinger seconded. Motion carried.

2020 Treasurer's Report: Pastor made note that in spite of COVID in the past year, the church received \$10,000 more in donations than expenses, even without PPP. Vicki Pellmann also announced that the PPP loan had been fully forgiven, so it would no longer be shown as a liability. Rich Hoffelmeyer motioned to approve the treasurer's report; Rich Trent seconded. Motion carried.

In Loving Trust Interest: The interest from the In Loving Trust was \$1,074.97. Dale Gruenewald presented council's recommendation to put the interest towards the purchase of a new AED unit as the current one needs replaced. Vicki Pellmann shared the current one was a donation and an attempt at fixing it was not successful. Attempts to acquire a new one by donation have also been unsuccessful. Dave Woehlke motioned to approve council's recommendation; Linda Hopfinger seconded. Motion carried.

Constitutional and Bylaws Changes: Pastor presented two proposed changes to the Constitution and By-Laws. The first change pertains to the potential dissolution of the church: Article X, Section 122 will be updated to allow for the remaining congregational members to determine to which non-profit any remaining funds shall be transferred, while Section 8, Paragraph D of the By-Laws will be updated to give records to the St. Clair County Historical Society. Kelly Woehlke raised concern about making sure we account for the continued care for Freivogel Cemetery and further discussions centered around refining the constitutional language in the future. Dave Woehlke motioned to approve the change; Gary Shondy seconded. Motion carried.

The second change was for the purpose of duplication of language. Article VIII, Section 116 provides the guidance for how the council should be composed; Section 8, Paragraph A of the By-Laws repeats the language of how council should be composed. Sean Mahoney motioned to approve removing the duplicative language from the By-Laws; Kathi Trent seconded. Motion carried.

Consolidating Office Position: Darlene Gansmann is due to retire as Church Secretary on April 1st. Council has been discussing filling her position and determined consolidating the current Secretarial position with the separate Treasurer's position is ideal. Kim Mueller and Les Mehrtens have already invested some time in gathering job requirements and are seeking additional people to serve on the hiring committee. Les Mehrtens motioned to consolidate the two positions into one; Dave Woehlke seconded. Motion carried.

Rich Trent motioned to adjourn; Darren Gruenewald seconded. Motion carried.

Meeting closed with The Lord's Prayer.

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Meeting called to order at 11:22 a.m. by President Dale Gruenewald. There were 44 members in attendance. Pastor opened with a prayer.

Z Team: Gary Shondy gave a short review of the details provided in the meeting agenda, including all the trimming, mowing and the usual upkeep around the church, church park and cemetery. He highlighted the newly paved sidewalk from the parking lot to the bridge at the park, the replacement of the glass block window after vandalism to the outbuilding, and the servicing of the boiler to keep it working. He ended with a note of thanks to all who helped throughout the year.

Church activities, fundraisers and long range plans: Dale asked those in attendance to review the agenda for the listed activities and fundraisers before proceeding to the list of completed and potential upcoming projects. Helen Vigna asked specifically about the elevator and if there were any plans to revisit replacing it. She mentioned concerns about the safety of the current elevator. Earl Doerr pointed out that it is inspected every year and passes code. Les Mehrtens elaborated to explain that two inspections are done: a maintenance inspection as well as a state inspection including weights to rate the capacity.

Election of Church Leaders: For the three vacancies for the 2022-2024 Council term, Dale read out the three proposed nominees: Annette Hund, Kurt Pellmann and Barbara Scharf. He then asked for any additional nominations; none were made. Bill Savering motioned to accept Annette Hund, Kurt Pellmann and Barbara Scharf for the 2022-2024 Council term; Darren Gruenewald seconded. Motion carried.

For the one vacancy for the 2022-2024 Board of Christian Education (BCE) term, Dale read out the one proposed nominee: Jodi Notter. He then asked for any additional nominations; none were made. Dave Woehlke motioned to accept Jodi Notter for the 2022-2024 BCE term; Linda Hopfinger seconded. Motion carried.

Budget: Dale began the budget discussion by thanking Darren Doerr, Les Mehrtens and Andrew Taake for their work on the budget committee and Richard Hoffelmeyer for all the advanced preparation of financial details from previous years. Dale referred to the proposed raises for employees, noting that the increase ensures the church employees are being appreciated for their hard work while the cost is largely offset by the savings from not paying organists during the summer. Dale also pointed out the inclusion of the preschool in the budget since those monies also run through the General Fund. Annette Hund motioned to accept the proposed 2022 budget; Krista Gruenewald seconded. Motion carried.

Old Business: There was no old business to discuss.

New Business: Earl Doerr introduced the idea of selling the Hecke property and using the proceeds to finance a larger replacement shed at the park. He presented images of common

pole sheds in the area, a style that would fit out at the park. Reasons for this proposal include the rough shape of the road out to the Hecke shed where all the yard sale goods are stored and the fact that it's an additional property the church has to maintain. Additionally, the current shed at the park is small in size for the amount of equipment that is stored there. He and Bill Albert received a valuation of the 3 acre property with the shed at \$99,000 to \$125,000 due to the favorable real estate market; now would be the time to get the highest possible sale value. Earl shared an estimation of \$48,035 for a 40'x60' building, concrete floor and electric, which was based on the low bid from Built Mor of \$40,700 for the building itself; two additional bids from Cleary (\$58,039) and Morton (\$63,735) were also received. He noted the church still needs to check with the village on ordinances at the park.

Andrew Taake asked about the location of the new shed, and Earl stated it would be in the same place. Linda Hopfinger requested clarification that there was no longer any interest in keeping the Hecke property and Dale reiterated that it is inconveniently located out of town, down a bad road and that the shed is bursting at the seams with yard sale donations every year.

Les Mehrtens asked about the realtor who provided the valuation on the Hecke property, and Earl provided the answer of Becky Demond. Les then reiterated the importance of first checking with the village about the shed before things go too far. Darrell Doerr asked if the park is zoned for industrial but Earl did not know off hand.

Helen Vigna raised a point about the need for a new shed at all, reasoning that with an aging and shrinking Z Team, the church may not be able to continue the yard sale much longer. Pastor referred back to the previously stated inconvenient distance to the Hecke property and bad road conditions being reason enough to sell, even if a new shed isn't built.

Krista Gruenewald brought up the float work for the lighted parade that was done out at their property which would be much more convenient to do in town if the larger shed was built. Dale furthered the point saying the larger shed could have additional benefits, including being a space for other youth projects and church events.

Earl stated he would check on the ordinances with the city.

Kathi Trent made a few final points for the benefit of selling the Hecke property, including the fact that the church currently pays taxes and insurance on the property.

Rich Trent motioned to adjourn; Joyce Tastad seconded. Motion carried.

Meeting closed with The Lord's Prayer.
